

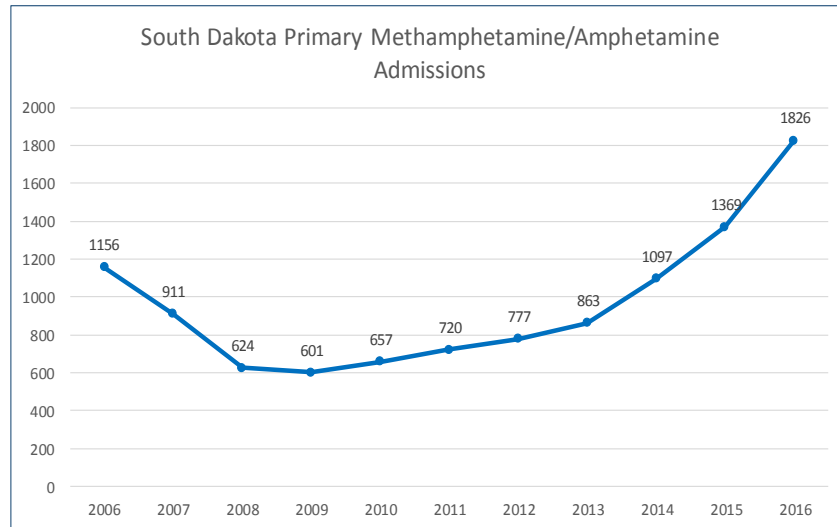

Trends in Methamphetamine Treatment Admissions 2006—2016

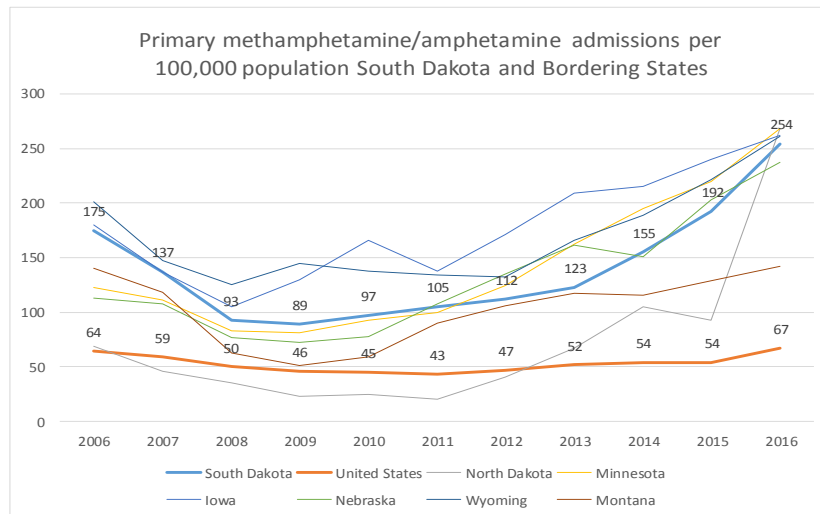
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Primary methamphetamine/amphetamine admissions has risen each year since 2009 with approximately 1,826 methamphetamine/amphetamine treatment admissions occurring in 2016.

A similar trend is observed in methamphetamine/amphetamine treatment admissions data for states bordering South Dakota. In 2016, South Dakota's methamphetamine/amphetamine treatment admission rate was 254 per 100,000. Minnesota and North Dakota had the highest rate in 2016 with 268 per 100,000 followed by Iowa at 262 per 100,000 and Wyoming 261 per 100,000. South Dakota and all bordering states exceeded the national average in 2016 of 67 per 100,000.

Note: An admission is defined as the formal acceptance of a client into substance abuse treatment, and has occurred if, and only if the client begins treatment.

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
